Time for the Young at Heart: or Children's Time

Other resources for your reflection of love in action and help shared in the world may come from neighbours, from newspaper articles, magazine articles which talk about shared love. You could share stories of prayer shawl ministries, or stories from service clubs who donate to hospitals, or support Service Dogs. Be creative in seeking local inspirational stories of love shared. Mandate magazine and the Observer carry stories that may be useful for this purpose.
